On Curriculum Development through Learning Outcomes & Quality Assurance through Curriculum Review







OBJECTIVE

The aim will be to introduce the participants to the skills required to develop high quality learning outcomes both at programme and course level. The first session will concentrate on the principles and use of learning outcomes, as defined by the ECTS Users Guide, with reference to linking the learning outcome to the course credits. The second session will concentrate on curriculum development and monitoring, introducing methodologies for both informal and formal review and change. This session will also cover curriculum mapping to ensure that the teaching and learning activities, assessments, and/or content of the courses align with the study program learning outcomes (instruments used to assess the achievement of the study program learning outcomes, direct/indirect measures, assessment plan).

OUTCOME

Participants will have actively participated in the Workshop, developing current skills and learning new skills. Participants will also have agreed a set of activities and objectives with real outcomes that will be presented at a second Workshop held before July 2024. The agreed activities and objectives of each participant will be decided to fit with the overall objectives of the Mission as defined by the host Institution.

FORMAT

This one-day workshop will be divided into two sessions. Both sessions will be divided into presentations by the Workshop leaders and participant activity sessions, led by the Workshop leaders.

About Bologna Hub Peer Support project¹

The "Bologna Hub Peer Support II" project is funded by Erasmus+ and the German Federal Ministry of Education and Research. The German Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF), as the Erasmus+ National Authority, has designated the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), as the Erasmus+ National Agency for Higher Education, as acting agent of the project. In this role the DAAD will coordinate the project and ensure the implementation of activity as lead partner of the consortium. The BMBF itself will be involved as project partner in an advisory capacity.

Building on the achievements of the project "Bologna Hub Peer Support" (2020-2022), the main objective of the project "Bologna Hub Peer Support II" (2022-2024) is to continue to foster the implementation of the Bologna key commitments and the application of the Bologna tools at higher education institutions throughout the European Higher Education Area (EHEA). By featuring a pool of European Bologna Experts (including national Bologna Experts, Higher Education Reform Experts and other higher education experts) that support institutions in the entire EHEA with the implementation of Bologna reforms through methods of peer-learning, the project "Bologna Hub Peer Support II" takes up this approach. To further pursue "a structured peer support approach based on solidarity, cooperation and mutual learning", this project will build on the already existing pool of experts which has been set up in the context of the previous project, while similarly enabling the inclusion of additional experts. At least 30 HEI in the entire EHEA will be supported in the implementation of Bologna reforms through methods of peer-learning. Based on the individual needs of higher education institutions, the experts will provide tailor-made counselling during the meetings with those institutions that apply for an expert peer support mission.
